
PERSPECTIVES ON BETHEL UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL

Jon Eliason

Bethel Linebacker: 1989-91

Career: S. Martin Lindenauer Collegiate Professor of Vascular Surgery Co-Director, Frankel Cardiovascular Center Multidisciplinary Aortic Program, University of Michigan

Eliason, an All-MIAC linebacker, was an instrumental player in Bethel becoming a successful football program. After graduating with a degree in biology, Eliason has gone on to a distinguished medical career. After getting his medical degree from the University of Minnesota, he completed his general surgery residency at Vanderbilt University which was followed by a two-year Vascular Surgery Fellowship at the University of Michigan. During this time, he was also in the United States Air Force and served as a staff surgeon at Lackland Air Force Base in Texas and was deployed to Balad, Iraq as a vascular surgeon. Upon completing his time in the Air Force, he began in his current position at the University of Michigan.



Why did I choose Bethel?

I came to Bethel as a sophomore transfer student-athlete from an NCAA Division II program in California. I still wanted to play a high level of football, but I knew I needed more in the way of spiritual comeradery. I also desired a pre-med track, and this was more solidified at Bethel.
